If you're registered with your local library, you can sign up to [BorrowBox](#) to borrow an eBook, meaning you don't have to spend lots of money buying each book.

Online Book Club

Here's what to do:

1. Plan the logistics

- Are you going to set a limit on the number of people that can be involved?
- Are you going to invite specific friends or put a general call out on social media?
- How often are you going to 'meet'?
- How much will you charge people to take part? You could either ask for a one-off donation to join, or a smaller donation for each discussion they join
- You should pick the first book. You should then think about how you will decide who picks the book each week. Whoever picks the book should be in charge of leading the discussion that week.
- What platform will you use to host your discussion? Google Hangouts, Facebook Messenger and Zoom are just a few of the options!

2. Set up a [Virgin Money Giving](#) page linked to our [Coronavirus Resilience Appeal](#) for members to donate their entry fee to

- We're challenging you to set a fundraising target of £150 overall. If this seems a bit daunting, it could be achieved through multiple challenges!
- You can ask people who don't want to be involved if they'd still be willing to donate.
- We would advise not posting the meet-up link on your page as this will be public, but make sure to send it to all participants!

3. Reach out to people to get involved

- We've written a few template posts below if you're stuck. Whilst you should be sensitive to the fact that some people will have financial concerns at the moment and won't be able to donate, there will be others who are spending less on socialising and commuting and therefore will be feeling more able to be generous at the moment - and will be keen to find things to do to fill their evenings!
- Don't forget to let them know what the first book will be, add a link to your donation page and to the video discussion, and let them know when the first meeting will be.

4. Enjoy!

Above all this is meant to be a chance to have fun and bring people together, so make sure to enjoy it!
